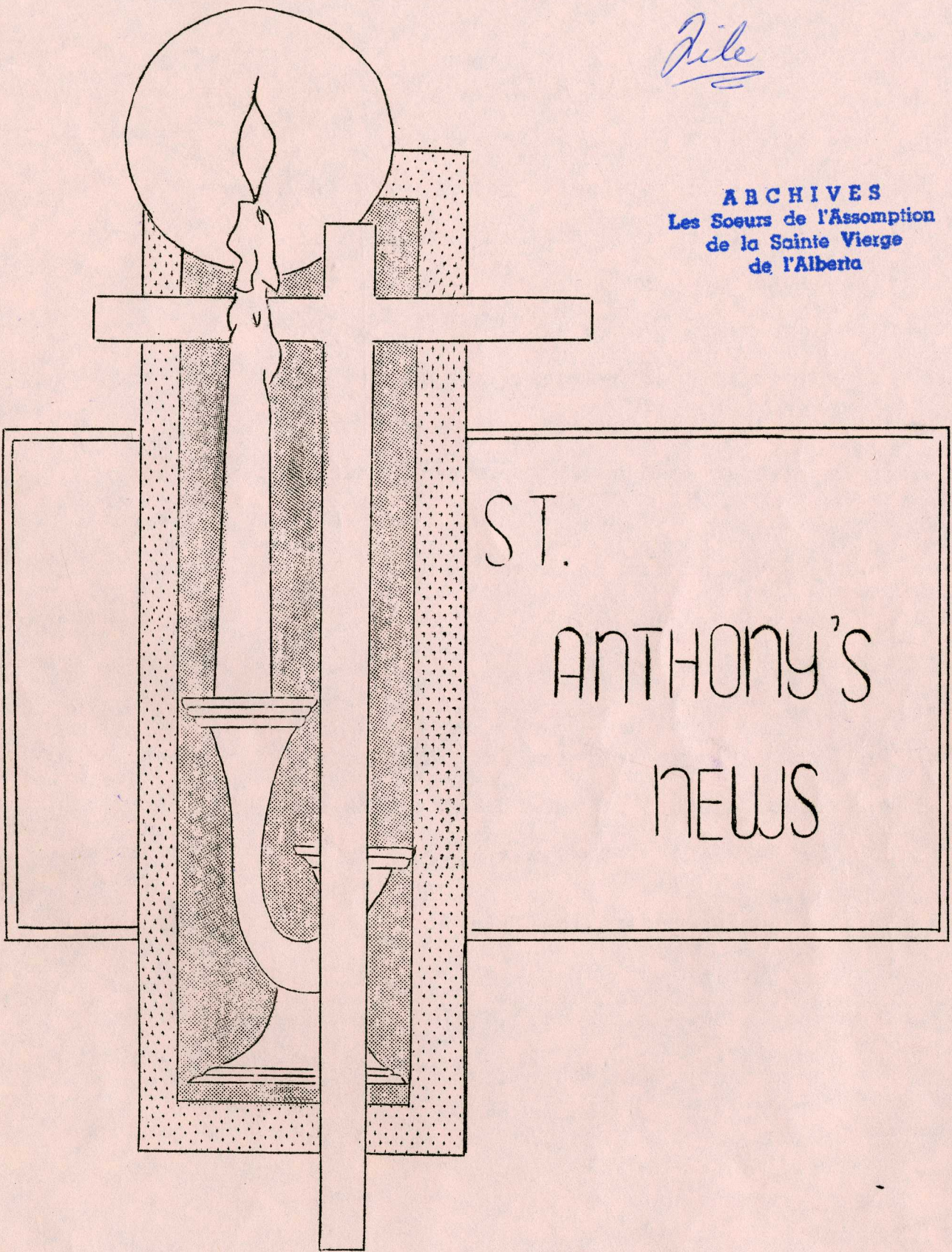

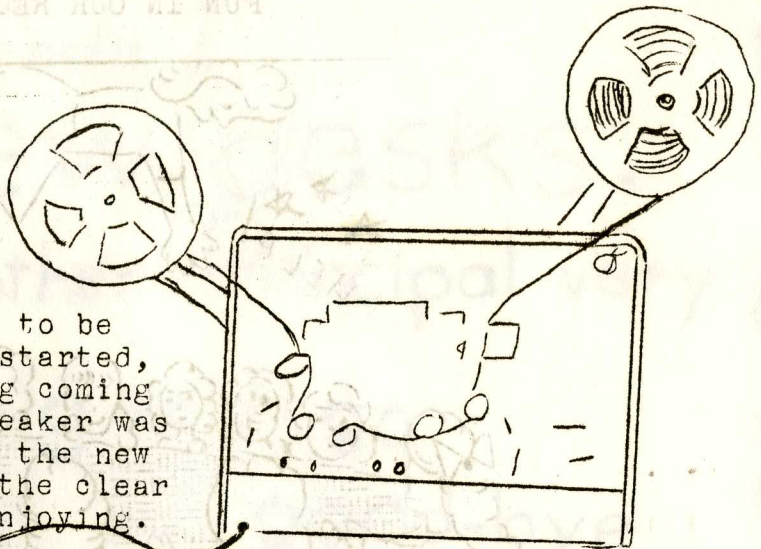
Most of the books are fairy tales, but we have other books about Christians, adventure and other stories.

WINDOW PAINTING

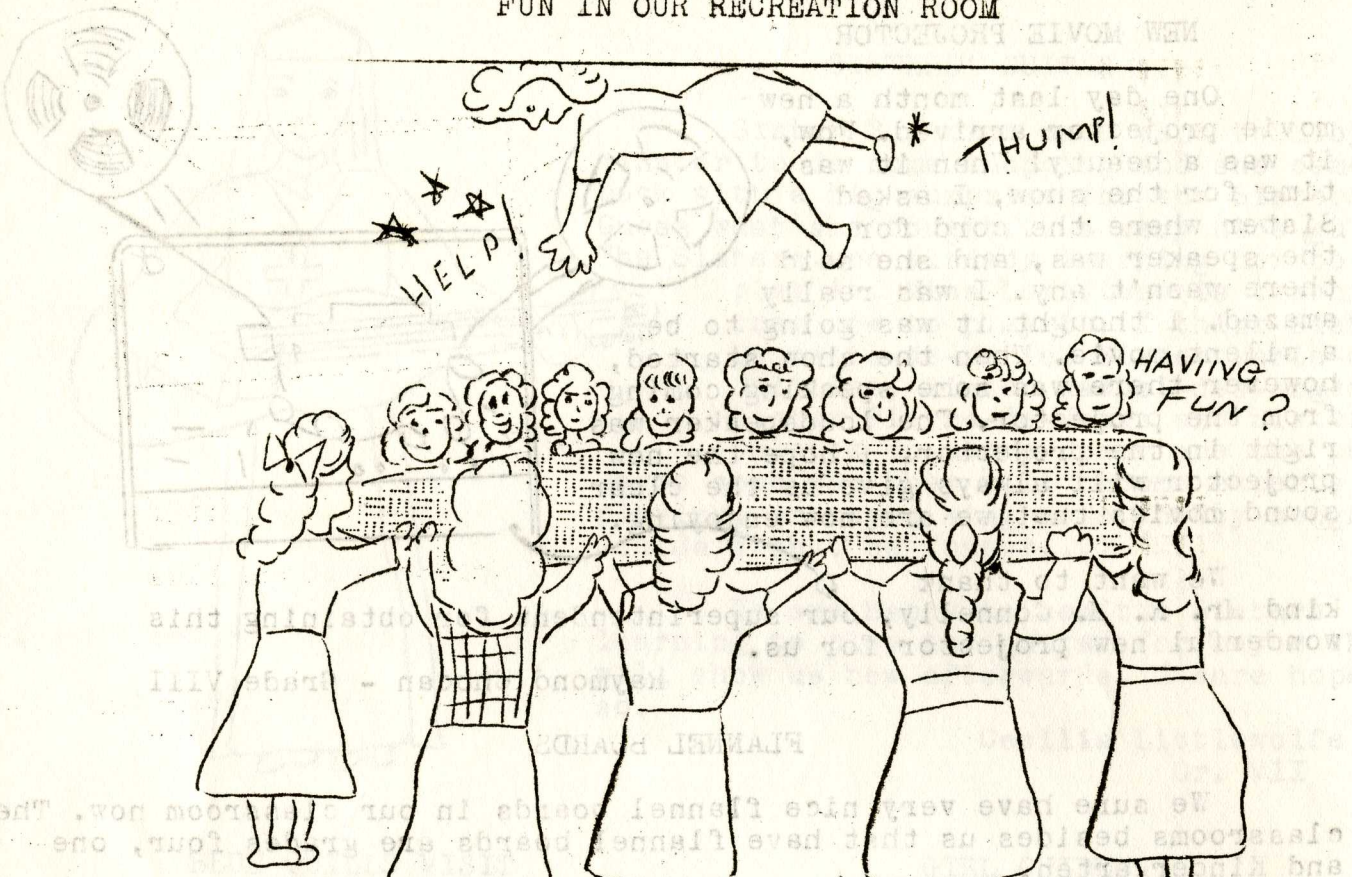

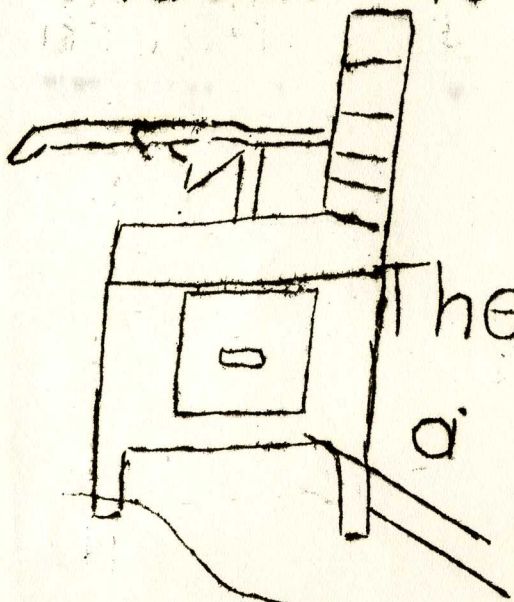

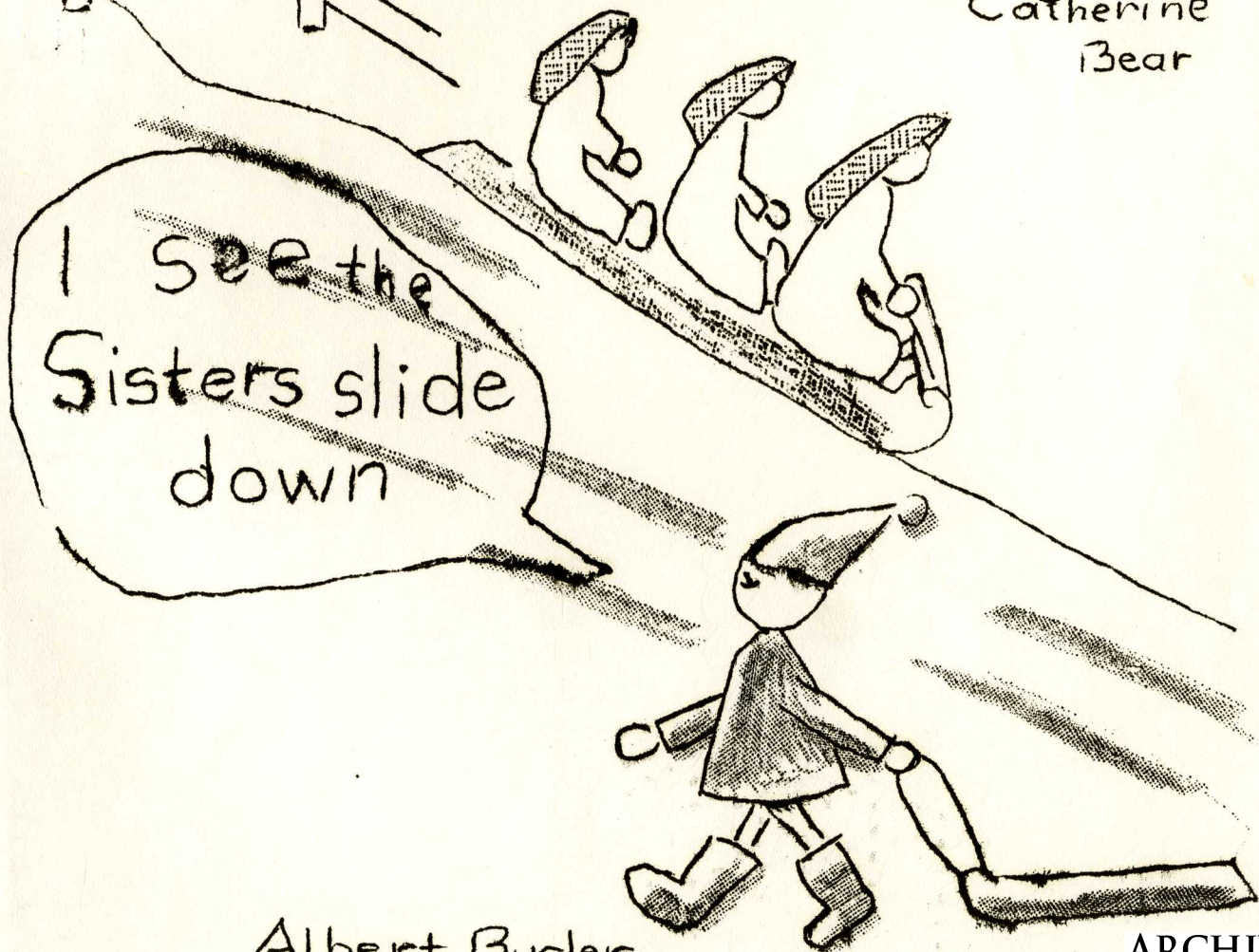
