Mr Justice *Scott*.

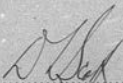
Friday day, the *31st* day of
October, A.D. 1919

UPON APPLICATION made this day to the Court by the
Plaintiff and upon hearing counsel, and it appearing that
upon the *3rd* day of *April 1919* it was adjudged and
decreed that the marriage had and solemnized on the 30th
day of March, A.D. 1910, at the City of Calgary in the
Province of Alberta between the Plaintiff and the Defendant
be dissolved by reason that since the celebration thereof
the said Defendant has been guilty of adultery and the said
Defendant has been guilty of cruelty and desertion, and unless
sufficient cause is shown to the Court why this Decree should
not be made absolute within *6* months from the making
thereof and no such cause having been shown *and it appearing*
that no cause has been shown

IT IS ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the said marriage
